

Pvt college students allege harassment

Jaipur: Even with less than three weeks remaining to their examination, the students of a private medical institute have been running from pillar to post to seek action against the alleged malpractices of the institute administration.

Students of the National Institute of Medical Sciences (NIMS) alleged that the institute administration has been forcing them to switch from Rajasthan University of Health Sciences (RUHS) to NIMS University.

The situation became bitter when a few students went to meet a senior college administrator and reportedly clashed with guards and allegedly threw stones.

“The court has permitted the students to continue their studies with the RUHS. However the NIMS administration has been threatening to fail us in the practical examinations if we do not shift our registration to NIMS University,” said an agitating student.

However the college administration claimed that the issue is being “created” by few students who have failed to comply with the eligibility criteria.

“Only a handful of students who had failed to comply with the attendance and internal assessment criteria have been making a fuss of the issue,” said VS Tomar, director NIMS.

The issue arose after NIMS, which was earlier affiliated to RUHS, was converted to an university under the NIMS University Act. The students allege that the NIMS course have yet not been recognized by the Medical Council of India (MCI).
